Obuda was a former city in Hungary that was merged with Buda and Pest on 1 January 1873; it now forms part of District 3 of Budapest. The core part around Kolossy square is a Protected Area, with lot of centuries-old buildings. The district centre: Florian Square and the Main Square. The island (Obuda Island) next to this part of the city today hosts the mid-summer Sziget Festival, a huge European music and cultural festival. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Vw8D86JND-k

Obuda's centre is Fő tér (Main Square), connected to a tiny square with a sculpture of people with umbrellas waiting for the rain to stop. It is accessible by the commuter railway, HEV (Arpad hid station). Many touristic attractions, nice cafes, restaurants, hotels and historical places can be found in the central part of Old Buda. It is a paradise for cyclists as the district is full of bicycle roads and beautiful green areas for outdoor entertainments.

Plenty of beautiful bridges connect Buda and Pest sides of the city over the River Danube. It is worth to explore them and visit particularly the Margaret Island (exclusive pedestrian and recreational area) via the Margaret Bridge and enjoy trees, parks, pools, open air theatres and restaurants during the summer season. A pleasant and romantic way to admire the scenic riverfronts is by going on a cruise on the Danube combined by a nice dinner.
