

District V. (Belváros/Downtown) – Inner City of Budapest – Hungary – Europe

District V (Belváros/Downtown) – Inner City, this is the main financial district as well as entertainment hub of Budapest. The recently opened Fashion Street in Deák Ferenc Street makes the area an investment hotspot in downtown Budapest for both residential and business. The border line runs along the Danube, where famous places can be found: Petőfi Square, Vigado Square, Roosevelt Square and the Parliament House are located on the embankment. Several dining and sightseeing boats run from ports of the riverfront.

Numerous beautiful bridges connect Buda and Pest sides of the city over the River Danube. It is worth to explore them and visit particularly the Margaret Island (exclusive pedestrian and recreational area) via the Margaret Bridge and enjoy trees, parks, pools, open air theatres and restaurants during the summer season. A pleasant and romantic way to admire the scenic riverfronts is by going on a cruise on the Danube combined by a nice dinner. Walk along Dunakorzó (Danube Promenade) and enjoy the beautiful view of the River Danube, the Chain Bridge and the Castle Hill.

District V is Budapest's Central Business District, which includes plenty of thousands of office spaces. Set in the heart of prestigious buildings or brand new contemporary buildings featuring innovative architecture, the business district is always the reflection of a country's economic development standard. This district hosts most of the Government bodies and institutions, headquarters of banks, financial institutions and consulting firms, they have been extended by service companies. The administrative centre of whole Budapest is also located in District V. The most prestigious luxury 5 star hotels are also located in this region offering excellent conference venues for international meetings. You can get to and travel within the area by several public transport services. All four Budapest metro lines have stations in the district.

A new, mostly pedestrian area has recently been constructed between Kálvin Square and Szabadság Square called Budapest's new main street of Inner City. The aim of the project was to create a lively, pedestrian-friendly Main Street in the Inner City with benches to sit down, terraced cafes and restaurants to stop for cafe or lunch and with much less traffic and noise. The famous pedestrian shopping area, Váci Street cuts through the district, with the Great Market Hall at its one end, and Vörösmarty Square on the other end, home to the annual Christmas Fair and Winter Festival.
